Prime University is going to organize its 2nd Convocation on 24th April, 2016 at Convention Hall of Police Staff College, Mirpur-14, Dhaka. It will be held in ambience of excellent achievements of the University over the last 14 years. More than 9000 graduates from different disciplines who completed their requirements to acquire degree up to Summer Semester 2015 will receive certificates. Some of them will be given gold medals for their outstanding results. The students will fill up the prescribed Registration Forms, paying all the dues, returning the books borrowed from the library. Convocation Registration fee is to be paid in the form of cash or by

pay order. The last date of registration is 15th March, 2016. The Gown will be provided by the University at the rehearsal on 23rd April 2016. Before taking delivery of the original Degree Certificate, the student concerned is to return the Provisional Certificate.

On the occasion, the Education Minister, Mr. Nurul Islam Nahid, MP, will be present on behalf of the honorable Chancellor, Mr. Md. Abdul Hamid, President, the People's Republic of Bangladesh. The program will be rounded up by a special cultural program with guest artists.

Nanotechnology, the technology that operates in nano(one-billionth) – scale has the potential to create a wealth of new materials and manufacturing possibilities that profoundly impact our economy, environment and society. The implications of nanotechnology are wide-ranging and future applications for nanotechnology seem only to be limited by the creativity of researchers. Understanding the importance of nanotechnology in the current context, Department of Electrical and Electronic Engineering arranged a seminar entitled "Prospects of Nanotechnology" on 6th January 2015 at Prime University. The Vice Chancellor of Prime University Professor Dr. M Abdus Sobhan was the Chief Guest and Professor Dr. M Abul Hossain Sikder, Pro-vice Chancellor, Mir Shahabuddin, Member, Board of Trustees, Prime University and Aysha Khanom, Chairman, Central Committee, Bangladesh Mahila Parishad were the Special Guests in the discussion. The Head of the Department of Law Dr. Noor Mohammad chaired the session. Faculty members of different departments and students of different programs attended the discussion. The discussion started with an opening speech by Md. Mostafijur Rahman, Sr. Lecturer, Department of Law, Prime University. The speakers say that the

Bangladesh Constitution declares equal rights for men and women in all spheres of public life, though women continue to be treated as inferior human beings by their husbands and by a society that tends to victimize them instead of helping them. Women's rights in Bangladesh have been an issue for decades. One of the main reasons for this problem is the religion of the country. Many men do not agree with women acquiring equal rights as men because of religious reasons. The Bangladesh Mahila Parishad wisely emphasized to implement the judgment of the High Court Division on prevention of oppression against women and children which should be applicable to all citizens. It is based on principle of equality, principle of non-discrimination, and principle of state obligation. They argued that the Constitution of Bangladesh ensures the right of man and woman in all spheres of public life and it is one of the fundamental rights. So for the requirement of time the judgment should be implemented which removes all kinds of discriminations against women.

The 8th Training of the New Faculty Members

As a part of human resource development, the Centre for Research, HRD and Publications of Prime University organized a training of the new faculty members of the University. It was the 8th training program organized so far by the Centre for the new faculty members. Twenty seven faculty members of different departments participated in the program.

The training program started on the 2nd November, 2015. With demo presentations of all the participants the program finished on 27th December, 2015. Thirteen sessions were held during the program. The trainers of the program were learned educationalists from in and outside the University. Certificates will be awarded to all the successful participants.
